

Programs/Assistance for Children's Recreation

Jerry Love Children's Fund

Administered by City of Mississauga Recreation and Culture, the Jerry Love Children's Fund raises thousands of dollars each year to help hundreds of children enjoy the benefits of participating in recreation programs. Making recreation programs available to children who might otherwise be unable to afford them is what the Jerry Love Children's Fund is all about.

Eligibility

Only Children's recreation programs that are operated by the Recreation Division are eligible for subsidy. The subsidization program is restricted to residents of Mississauga 15 years of age and under. Subsidy does not apply to H3O, Semi Private or Private Lessons.

Eligible children may receive a subsidy for 1 course code per calendar year, or a 1 or 3 month **Swim/Skate Pass**. The maximum amount of subsidy for any program or session is \$160. Since funds are limited, the agency or parent/guardian will be required to pay the difference for any program exceeding the \$160 maximum. Subsidy does not include extra costs associated with program.

Applicants in receipt of the Jerry Love Children's Fund cannot receive benefits from the ActiveAssist fee assistance program in the same calendar year.

Procedure

The child's school social worker or a social worker from a Community Agency can assess the family situation, and if they qualify, will fill out a "Jerry Love Referral for Subsidy" form, which then must be attached to a completed Registration Application Form. The Referral form is to be completed by the Social Worker for the client. If an additional payment is to be made by the parent/guardian or agency, then it must be submitted with these forms, or placed on the Family Account at any Mississauga Community Centre; registrations will not be processed until additional payment is received.

All completed subsidized registration information is to be forwarded to Dana Clarke, Recreation Division Customer Service Centre, Ground Floor, Central Library building, 301 Burnhamthorpe Road West, Mississauga ON L5B 3Y3. Phone (905) 615-3200 extension 4274, FAX (905) 615-4101.

Program Registration

All referral documents and registration information must be submitted to the Recreation Division Customer Service Centre well in advance of the program start date to allow time to send the Registration Confirmation to the parent/guardian via Canada Post; we are unable to telephone families to confirm registration. Registrations are first come, first served, and you may check the status of a program at any time via activemississauga.ca, which is a live database.

If funding is unavailable, or the registrations cannot be processed for any reason, the parent/guardian and/or Agency will be contacted by telephone.



Currently there is a waiting list for social housing in Peel. You will be placed on this waiting list once you have submitted a complete application and have been determined eligible for social housing. Because of the high demand for subsidized housing the wait may take many years.

Services for Homeless People

We provide support to people who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness. Our services include emergency and transitional shelters, street outreach, support services and help to find permanent housing.

Subsidized Rental Housing

Apply for subsidized rental housing, find affordable market rentals and other resources to find affordable housing. You can also appeal your decision if you were denied subsidy, apply for Ontario Works (financial assistance and program supports) and apply for subsidized child care.

Market (non-subsidized) Rental Housing

Rental units are available at market (non-subsidized) rate through Peel Living, the Region of Peel's non-profit housing company. For details on all available units please visit the <u>Viewit</u>Website.

Financial Assistance

<u>Time-Limited Housing Allowance and Employment Program</u>

Eligible Peel Access to Housing (PATH) applicants, **who are currently employed**, may have the opportunity to participate in a new program providing a housing allowance of up to \$550 a month, for up to five years, and one-on-one support to further develop employment skills.

Initial Eligibility Requirements:

- Have an active, complete and eligible file on the PATH centralized wait list
- Employed or another member on your application is employed
- Have a minimum gross (before tax) household annual income of \$25,000
- · Currently living in Peel (Brampton, Caledon or Mississauga)

- Not a homeowner
- · Not receiving a rent subsidy or housing allowance

Preventing Homelessness in Peel Program (PHIPP)

Provides one-time emergency assistance to low-income families and individuals who need help to pay overdue bills and/or mortgage and are at risk of losing their housing.

You may be eligible to receive assistance if you:

- live in Peel,
- are under threat of eviction, or are currently homeless or living in a temporary shelter,
- · have tried all other options for financial and housing supports, including friends and family,
- are not eligible for Ontario Works (OW), Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP), or financial support from any other agency, and
- have legal status in Canada: includes permanent citizen, legal immigration status/ landed immigrant (that is, not a visitor), convention refugee.

Peel Public Health offers Free dental cleaning, check-ups, and treatment for children

Peel Public Health has a government-funded dental program that provides free dental cleaning and emergency dental services for children and youth 0-17 years.

Who is eligible?

Your household is automatically enrolled in the program if you or your child receives benefits through:

- Ontario Works
- Temporary Care Assistance
- Ontario Disability Support Program
- · Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities

Children are eligible for the program if they:

- are 17 years of age and under
- live in Ontario
- be able to show financial hardship

Note: A dental screening may be needed to see if there is a clinical need

Child Care Fee Subsidy

What is child care fee subsidy?

The Region of Peel provides financial assistance to help families with their child care costs for children up to 12 years of age in licensed child care programs.

Subsidized care is available in <u>centre-based</u>, <u>school-based</u> and <u>home-based</u> <u>child</u> <u>care programs</u> in Brampton, Caledon and Mississauga.

As of September 2014, children eligible for <u>full-day kindergarten</u> can only access a child care fee subsidy for the extended day (before-and-after school) programs, including PA days, March Break and other school holidays.

Who can apply?

Families with children up to 12 years of age who meet the eligibility criteria can apply for a child care fee subsidy.

What are the eligibility criteria for a child care fee subsidy?

To be eligible for a child care fee subsidy you must:

- Have filed last year's income tax return and have your current Notice of Assessment (NOA) or Canada Child Benefit (CCB) Notice
- 2. Live in Peel (Brampton, Caledon, Mississauga)
- 3. Be a Canadian citizen, landed immigrant or refugee with a valid work permit or study permit
- 4. Be the parent, foster parent or legal guardian of the child(ren) and living with them
- 5. Be working, self-employed, in school or in a training program full-time or part-time as described below.

Working parents

You can apply if you are working full time or part time. To verify your hours of work you must provide two recent consecutive pay stubs or a letter from your employer on company letterhead confirming the hours of work and rate of pay.

Self-employed parents

You are generally considered to be self-employed if you are actively working in a self-employed activity and you claim business expenses against your income.

Student parents

You must be attending school or a recognized training program on a full-time or part-time regular basis. This may include high school, English as a Second Language (ESL), college/university and training programs.

Please note: If your English as a Second Language or training program provides child care, you will not be able to receive assistance through the child care fee subsidy program.

Families with special needs

Call us to complete a referral if you require child care due to the special needs of your child.

Ontario Works participants

If you are participating in the Ontario Works Program and need child care, contact your <u>Ontario Works</u> <u>Case Worker</u>.

When should I apply for child care fee subsidy?

Currently there is no wait list for a child care fee subsidy. You can apply when you need assistance with your child care costs as follows:

- a. You have found a subsidized child care space at a licensed child care provider.
- b. You have a confirmed date to start work/school.

We recommend that you apply four to six weeks before your confirmed start date to ensure we have enough time to review your application and for you to attend your appointment.

Family Workshops

Literacy Workshops

Literacy skills are learned before children start school and are the building blocks for lifelong learning.

The Region of Peel's *free* Family Literacy Program is a series of nine workshops that will help parents learn how to support their child's literacy development. Spend time as a family while you learn how to:

- Increase your child's vocabulary
- Make books an enjoyable part of daily life
- Use math throughout the day
- · Help your child make the connection between signs, labels, logos and words
- Help your child develop early writing skills
- Use play to help your child build their literacy skills
- Set television limits and guide your child's viewing habits

Family Literacy programs are offered in English, Mandarin, Punjabi and French.
