
THE VILLAGE OF MALTON HAS SEEN MANY IMPROVEMENTS OVER THE PAST SEVEN YEARS

FINALLY...GOREWAY BRIDGE ACTUALLY ON ITS WAY!

After 30 years of clogged traffic at the CN rail crossing, agreements are being signed, construction contracts are being tendered and life as Malton drivers have known it, is coming to an end!

Goreway Bridge is the most amazingly complicated tangle I have encountered in 38 years in politics, but relief is on the horizon for those who work in Brampton.

- CN has agreed to assuming 1/3 costs, which is being incorporated into all the agreements.
- The agreement with the Region of Peel has been finalized.
- Lawyers from the Cities of Brampton (lead city on project) and Mississauga continue to tie ribbons on final agreements - always a long and arduous process.
- The design of the Regional access road is complete and unapproved accesses to Goreway on the Brampton side are being closed.
- Brampton Realty staff are completing negotiations with property owners for expropriation of some needed lands on the Brampton side.
- Brampton staff are going to tender early 2022 with construction anticipated to start summer 2022 and completed in 18 months.
- Public consultation indicated a strong preference for closing Goreway to traffic which will shorten construction from 3 years to 18 months.
- An overpass for cars rather than an underpass requiring a rerouting of the rails have also shortened the construction complications by at least another year.

The Goreway Bridge will be open December 2023! "May the force be with us"!

BUILDING A STRONGER COMMUNITY

EXCITING NEW BASKETBALL COURTS AT PAUL COFFEY PARK

On Saturday, September 25, the City of Mississauga and the Nav Bhatia Superfan Foundation unveiled a full NBA basketball court and refurbished three 3-on-3 courts, located at Malton's Paul Coffey Park.

Bringing something extra special to the Malton community and to Mississauga as a whole, basketball lovers from across our community can now come here to play, connect and bond over the game. Thank you to Nav and the Superfan Foundation for their partnership and support in helping make Malton a thriving place for everyone to enjoy. The Superfan has not forgotten his first home in Canada.

In addition to three courts for 3-on-3 games, there is also one International Basketball Federation (FIBA) regulation size court, which has the ability to host tournaments. There are stands for fans to enjoy watching the play.

When asked about the contribution, Nav Bhatia said, "Malton is very special to me. It is where my family began our life in Canada. It was the warm welcome we received from such a diverse community that gave us the strength to build the life we have today. We are proud to give back with these courts. Basketball changed my life and I hope these courts will bring people together for generations to come".

It is important to know, these courts will not require booking. They belong to the village to spontaneously pick up a basketball and play as much as they would like. Nav Bhatia will be organizing tournaments with Raptors players doing guest appearances. Rexdale produced the first Canadian, Dalano Banton, drafted by the Raptors. Malton will now provide the next!

TRAFFIC CALMING

In July 2021, the City of Mississauga began Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) operations in neighbourhood school area Community Safety Zones utilizing two mobile automated speed enforcement units.

The first Malton location where cameras were deployed was Morning Star Drive between Lancaster Drive and Netherwood Road.

The cameras enforced the posted 30km/h speed limit between July 5th and August 3rd. Preliminary data collected shows the average speed was reduced by more than 11 km/h on Morning Star Drive.

A total of 298 tickets were issued on Morning Star Drive. The average fine was approximately \$140 with the maximum fine issued was \$544.00.

A total of 495 tickets were issued at the first two ASE camera locations: 298 tickets at Morning Star Drive and 197 at Sawmill Valley Drive.

The average fine was approximately \$140.00 on Morning Star Drive and approximately \$126.00 on Sawmill Valley Drive with the maximum fines issued being \$544.00 and \$607.00 respectively.

During the month-long enforcement period, a combined 55 repeat offenders received tickets. The highest speeding ticket on Morning Star Drive was 67km/hr. More than double the posted speed limit of 30 km/h.

Throughout October and November, the 20 additional cameras will continue to be deployed and begin enforcing 30 km/h speed limits around the City, with two cameras being utilized per Ward.

Cameras will be active for at least one month at each location before rotating to a new location. The cameras will be in place 24-hours a day, seven days a week, including holidays.

THE MALTON YOUTH HUB

The Jonathon Davis Centre

The City of Mississauga and the Region of Peel have recognized the need for quality space being dedicated to Malton's youth. With both Councils approving funding and several very generous private sector donors, the City is converting the no longer viable pool at Lincoln M. Alexander SS into a welcoming, safe youth space specifically designed to meet the needs of Malton's young people. It will be a spacious place for kids to just hang out, do homework, listen to music or play video games. They can organize their own special events and also book private appointments with some of the youth-oriented organizations that will be tenants on the upper floor.

The \$12.7m conversion will result in:

- 18,300 ft2 in a fully renovated ground floor (12,500 ft2) and partial second floor(5,800 ft2) around a huge two storey atrium filled with natural light
- a fully equipped and stocked teaching kitchen (3,000 ft2) for snacking, quick breakfasts and most importantly, learning how to cook healthy meals
- a professional quality recording studio for budding artists
- individual rooms for meetings, art work, theatrical ventures and numerous other youth-organized events
- the Peel District School Board is partnering with the City to build an all-weather track right behind the Hub, an added feature for the youth and for the community at large.

Timelines are moving toward an official opening in the Fall of 2023.

- architectural plans and applications for permits have been submitted to the City and are progressing well
- tenders for the demolition of the pool, decking and associated pool equipment will be requested in November
- demolition will take place in December while tenders for the construction of the project will be put out late December/January

We all look forward to the Official Opening some time in the Fall of 2023. Upon opening, young people from Lincoln and Ascension Secondary Schools will be asked to select their own representatives to sit on the Board of Directors for the Hub.

HYACINTH HARPER, BEVERLY PATTERSON AND LINCOLN GILLESPIE



Bombardier has begun construction of a new Global manufacturing centre right here in Malton. The massive steel-beamed

skeleton can be seen on the Airport lands, seeming to stretch endlessly behind buildings parallel to Derry road. Construction of the behemoth is set to be completed in 2023.

A world class facility for the final assembly

of Global aircraft, Bombardier will continue the aerospace tradition that got its start with such early founding companies as Victory Aircraft, A.V. Roe and other pioneers of flight, right here in Malton.

Environmentally responsible features are being built into the new plant that will reduce energy consumption by almost 60% and lower greenhouse emissions by more than half.

A private investment of \$400 million US will provide continuous work to highly skilled employees, some from the Downsview facility, which is closing, as well as a significant number of new hires from our local community.

Along with 300 flight-associated manufacturers and suppliers in Mississauga, Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Canada, Magellan Aerospace and Bombardier will make Malton 'The Triple Crown' of the aerospace industry.
